KEEPING PEOPLE & PETS TOGETHER THROUGH THE ANIMAL RELIEF FUND: HONEY CAT'S STORY

Thirteen years ago, outside Deming, New Mexico, a gentle orange tabby appeared on Carolyn's doorstep. "He wasn't feral, he just seemed lost," Carolyn recalls. "Like he didn't know where else to go." Carolyn, a senior living alone, brought the cat to her local veterinarian to check for a microchip. There wasn't one, but he was healthy and estimated to be about four years old. In that moment, Carolyn knew they had found each other for a reason. She named him Honey Cat and from then on, the two were inseparable. When Carolyn moved to Las Cruces, Honey Cat



came with her and settled comfortably into their new home where they continued their peaceful days together. Recently, Carolyn began noticing changes in Honey Cat. He wasn't eating as much, and he was losing weight. When she picked him up to cuddlesomething he normally loved, he flinched, clearly uncomfortable. Worried, she made an appointment with her veterinarian. The diagnosis was pancreatitis. The recommended lab work, treatment plan, and medication were overwhelming-not just emotionally, but financially also. On a fixed income, Carolyn found herself unsure of how to give Honey Cat the care he needed. That's when her vet suggested reaching out to the Doña Ana County Humane Society's Animal Relief Fund. Carolyn applied—and qualified—for two medical care vouchers and a prescription medication voucher through the program. Thanks to this support, Honey Cat is now receiving the treatment he needs and is slowly gaining weight and strength. "I'm so very grateful for the Animal Relief Fund," Carolyn shares. "The care and kindness I received from the Doña Ana County Humane Society has meant the world to me." The Animal Relief Fund is more than just a financial resource—it's a lifeline for people like Carolyn, and pets like Honey Cat. It ensures that no one has to choose between their love for their pet and the cost of veterinary care. The program offers vouchers to help cover the cost of vaccinations, veterinary care, and long-term medications for those experiencing financial hardship.

We're dedicated to preserving the bond between people and their pets.
Our Animal Relief Fund helps lowincome families cover essential veterinary costs. From emergency surgeries to critical medications, this program is a lifeline for Doña Ana County residents.

We issued over \$167,000 in vouchers through the Animal Relief Fund to Doña Ana County residents.



108 Vaccination Vouchers issued to help prevent disease and protect public health.



89 Prescription Medication
Vouchers for prescriptions like
insulin, allergy treatments,
cancer treatments, and heart
medications.



579 Medical Care Vouchers issued for wellness exams, emergency visits, and illness treatment.



9 Complex Care Vouchers issued to cover veterinary treatments and surgeries up to \$2,000.


